Bhopal: Ever wondered why of all plants 'tulsi' holds such importance in Hindu households and is worshipped along with Lord Krishna? If no, then be a part of the dance-drama to be staged at Ravindra Bhavan on March 16. This one-hour-long performance, by nearly 15 artistes on stage, titled 'Krishnapriya Tulsii' will be a presentation based on the life story of Tulsii. Artists mostly perform on famous excerpts of Ramayana and Mahabharata but no one has ever portrayed the story of Tulsii and Lord Krishna. So, this idea inspired me and I was motivated to work on it. It will definitely connect with the audience."

After playing in many tournaments, Khan established Itekhkar Cricket Academy, in remembrance of his mentor. His motive was to encourage young players and provide a platform for them to improve their cricket-playing skills. "I was happy playing cricket and coaching young players when one day Ashok Buniadi, director of State Bank's theatre group,

offered me to play a negative character in one of his plays. I accepted his offer and was attracted to the art of acting right away. It was after performing over 30 plays that I realised that cricket and theatre are the food for my soul and passion for my life," says a nostalgic Khan.

Life after retirement is for family Since then, Itekhkar Cricket Academy has been proudly organising national-level theatre fests in the city, all thanks to 'Mamu'. He also received Life Time Achievement Award in 2006 by Madhya Pradesh Government. Speaking of post-retirement plans, he says, "I have fulfilled all my dreams and now I want to dedicate my time to my family which has been supportive all these years. I want to live for them now."
